After learning that the walls of Jerusalem were broken down and the gates burned, Nehemiah prayed for God's help. When the Persian king allowed his cupbearer to return to Jerusalem, he gave Nehemiah letters and sent the cavalry for protection.

In 444 BC Nehemiah returned to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem. After he inspected the walls at night, he encouraged the people to begin the rebuilding project.
