## Bible Study - Following Jesus - Mark 3

People love to see their heroes. Who would you go out of your way to see?

Fairy tales often have a victim (like the damsel in distress), the villain (like a witch, giant or dragon), and the hero (like a white knight or prince). The victim is innocent, the hero is noble, and the villain is evil. In this study we see that some people think Jesus is a hero and others view him as deluded or a villain.
