Bible Study 3 - Be fruitful in relationships

After looking at a Christian's relationships with the world, the government and their employer (1 Peter 2:11-25), Peter turns to family relationships.

Wives with husbands

1 Peter 3:1-6 "Wives, in the same way submit yourselves to your own husbands so that, if any of them do not believe the word, they may be won over without words by the behaviour of their wives,

Husbands with wives

1 Peter 3:7 "Husbands, in the same way be considerate as you live with your wives, and treat them with respect as the weaker partner and as heirs with you of the gracious gift of life, so that nothing will hinder your prayers."

Ephesians 5:25-28 "Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave Himself up for her

Christians with fellow-believers

After looking at a Christian's relationships with the world, the government, their employer and their spouse (1 Peter 2:11-3:7), Peter turns to church relationships.

1 Peter 3:8 "Finally, all of you, be like-minded, be sympathetic, love one another, be compassionate and humble."

The Greek word translated "love" is "philadelphos", which means love between family members. So a church congregation should be like an extended family.
