Bible Study 11 – Who is the greatest? – Mark 9

In 1986, two ships collided in the Black Sea off the coast of Russia. Hundreds of passengers died as they were hurled into the icy waters below. An investigation of the disaster revealed it wasn't caused by a technological problem like a radar malfunction - or even thick fog. The cause was human stubbornness. Each captain was aware of the other ship's presence nearby. Both could have steered clear, but according to news reports, neither captain wanted to give way to the other. Each was too proud to yield first. By the time they came to their senses, it was too late. Today we look at how we are to live in our self-centred, competitive world.
