Bible Study 12 - Spiritual gifts - 1 Corinthians 12:4-26

Is modern culture too self-centred? One person says: "A large portion of society only cares about the welfare of themselves and a few closest to them. Everything is focused on how to make ourselves happy quickly. We tend to forget that there are others out there who are less fortunate than ourselves and we tend to minimise their plights to make ourselves feel better. Ask most people to donate some time for a cause and they are gone. It's about better themselves and everything else is an inconvenience. We have become the 'ME' culture. The selfie culture."

The context	The church at Corinth was plagued by factions and spiritual
	immaturity. Paul's letter to them addresses topics such as
	factions, sexual immorality, marital difficulties, lawsuits, lack of
	self-control, abuse of the Lord's Supper, and misuse of spiritual
	gifts. In chapters 12-14 he corrects their misuse of the gift of
	tongues (the ability to speak in languages previously unknown to
	the speaker).
