When Alan Shlemon states his Christian convictions, he often faces name calling. But he's not surprised by ridicule when he presents a Christian worldview. Instead he recognises it as a form of steamrolling and says "you seem to just be calling me names. Let's talk about our views instead of calling me names". Another approach is to ask, "What do you mean by that?". Often times, it will either not apply to him, if it does apply to him it also applies to them, or it doesn't even matter that it applies at all (because they're attacking character rather than the argument itself).

The context	After Jesus began to preach in Galilee, He chose 12 disciples.
	Then He preached the sermon on the Mount. After that He
	healed many and calmed a storm. Then He sent out the 12 to
	preach to the Jews (that people should repent) and heal. Our
	study is a part of a passage where Jesus tells the disciples how to
	deal with persecution. After this Jesus says that both John the
	Baptist and Himself were rejected (Matthew 11:16-19).
