## Bible Study 11 - Marriage for life - Matthew 19:1-6

There were 121,197 marriages registered and 46,498 divorces granted in Australia in 2014. That's a ratio of 38%. When you add the marriage separations that don't involve divorce, it's evident that at least 50% of marriages result in separation. And divorce statistics don't take in to account the breakdown of long-term de facto relationships (which are less stable than marriages) which in Australia have a very similar legal standing to marriages. Trends in couple formation and dissolution have resulted in an increase in the proportion of Australian adults who are unpartnered (typically 30-40%).

The context	Jesus had three years of ministry. The first year was His inauguration, in the second year He was popular, while in the third year He faced significant opposition. In Matthew 19, He leaves Galilee on His last trip to Jerusalem where the opposition will climax with Him being crucified as a criminal. He is in Perea, east of the Jordan river, where Herod Antipas ruled. John the Baptist had denounced Herod of unlawful divorce and remarriage to Herodias and this cost him imprisonment and his
	life (Mark 6:7-18).
