There are many con artists in Nigeria who email gullible Americans, promising to send them millions of dollars if they will send them their bank account numbers. Believers going through trials are especially vulnerable to spiritual con artists. They say, "If your God is good and powerful, then why did He allow you to go through this terrible tragedy? Either He is not very good, or He is not able to stop such trials." Usually, along with that line of thinking, they direct your attention to people in the world, who do not follow God, but whose lives are going very well. If you take the bait, you will not persevere in your trials.
