## Bible Study 5 - More disciples are called - John 1:43-51

The "Australian Skeptics" say that skeptics assess claims of the paranormal, but always with the understanding that extraordinary claims require extraordinary evidence. It is largely up to the claimants to provide such evidence. If someone tells you they can fly, skeptics would respond "Show me ... but under controlled conditions which rule out any chance of fakery or mistaken understanding". They claim to use critical thinking and reject religious or philosophical beliefs that often involve fear or ignorance. Today we will read about someone who was sceptical about Jesus.

The context	John was a disciple of Jesus and an eyewitness of Jesus'
	ministry. The purpose of the book is "that you may believe that
	Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing you
	may have life in His name" (Jn. 20:31). It deals with Christ's
	public ministry (Ch. 1-12), private ministry (13-17), suffering &
	death (18-19), & victory over death (20-21). John begins with
	the incarnation & deity of Christ. Then there is John's testimony
	& the calling of the first disciples.
