Bible Study 1 – Suffering proves salvation – 1 Peter 1:1-12

Peter writes this book to people who are suffering in what is part of modern Turkey. They don't understand why they're going through it, or what they should do about it. Sometimes it seems like we think we came up with the question of how suffering and pain could coexist with a good God: back then everyone assumed that good people got rewarded and bad people got punished ... and now we're like "Wait ... innocent people seem to suffer. Children die of starvation. The wicked go unpunished and the good unrewarded." Peter tells them how God equips us to survive in the real world.

The context	Peter was a disciple of Jesus and an eyewitness of Jesus'
	ministry. The purpose of the book is for "encouraging you and
	testifying that this is the true grace of God. Stand fast in it." (1
	Pt. 5:12). The central theme is to stand firm in the faith during
	suffering and persecution. Every chapter refers to suffering.
	It could have been written about AD 62, shortly before Nero's
	persecution. It deals with the believer's privileges & duties (1:1-
	2:10), relationships (2:11-4:6), and service & suffering (4:7-
	5:14).
