Bible Study 4 – We are a holy people – 1 Peter 2:4-10

The way we see ourselves determines to a large degree the way we act and react in life. Our self-perception, self-worth, self-esteem tends to be a governing factor in our life. If we see ourselves as a loser, we end up to a large degree acting like a loser. If we see ourselves as a victim, we tend to let people victimize us. If we see ourselves as uncreative, we never come up with any creative ideas. If we see ourselves as a piece of junk, we begin to think that we are garbage. If we see ourselves as successful, then we tend to repeat successes that we've had in the past. Our beliefs about ourselves determine our behaviour. Today we will look at our identity, status, standing and position as a Christian. God is the authority on who we are. He is the one we should be listening to about who we are.

	that this is the true grace of God. Stand fast in it" (1 Pt. 5:12).
	The central theme is to stand firm in the faith during suffering
	and persecution. Every chapter refers to suffering. It deals with
	the believer's privileges & duties (1:1-2:10), relationships (2:11-
	4:6), and service & suffering (4:7-5:14). It begins by reminding
	them of their secure future and the need for holiness and love for
	one another. Then because they are holy, believers are to show
	godly behaviour towards authorities, towards their spouse, and
	towards all believers.
