Bible Study 10 - Leadership and humility in the church - 1 Peter 5:1-7

The average churchgoer takes a few hours out of the week to experience the sacred. But the rest of the time, they are immersed in a society that no longer acknowledges the omniscient and omnipotent God who is to be loved and worshiped. Today we are too sophisticated for God. We can stand on our own; we are prepared and ready to choose and define our own existence. In this atmosphere humility cannot survive. It disappears with God. When God is neglected, the runner up god takes His place, namely, humanity. And that by definition is the opposite of humility, namely, pride.

The context	The central theme of the book is to stand firm in the faith during
	suffering and persecution. Every chapter refers to suffering. It
	deals with the believer's privileges & duties (1:1-2:10),
	relationships (2:11-4:6), and service & suffering (4:7-5:14). It
	begins by reminding them of their secure future and the need for
	holiness and love for one another. Then because they are holy,
	believers are to show godly behaviour towards authorities,
	towards their spouse, and towards all believers. Their behavior
	differs from that of the sinful world. They love & serve one
	another. And they should expect to suffer because of their faith.
