Bible Study 16 – Why does God allow tragedies? – John 11:17-27, 39-40

After training His disciples for three years, Jesus was about to die, be resurrected and leave them and ascend into heaven. He had one more lesson to strengthen their faith (v.14). It was His last great public miracle; the raising of a dead man. Jesus was about 40 km away (one day journey) on the east side of the Jordan River (10:40) when Lazarus got sick and died. After being told of the sickness, Jesus stayed two more days (v.6). Jesus knew that Lazarus had died (v.14). This miracle confirmed that Jesus was God Himself.

	Nicodemus, John the Baptist's testimony, & Jesus talks with a
	Samaritan woman. Then Jesus healed people in Galilee & in
	Jerusalem, fed 5,000 men, & taught about the bread of life. But
	the Jewish leaders opposed and challenged what Jesus said. As
	Jesus continued to teach & heal, the Pharisees opposed Him.
