## Bible Study 2 – Integrity and submitting to authority – Matthew 22:15-22

Coin flipping is a way of choosing between two alternatives. The person who calls correctly wins. It's often used to make decisions at the beginning of games and sports. But if someone says, "heads I win, and tails you lose", then you always lose! That's not fair. It's a way of saying, "I win, no matter what," while trying to trick someone into thinking they are getting a fair deal. It can be a metaphor for "rigged" systems. But it's how the Jewish leaders treated Jesus.

The context	The Pharisees were ardent Jewish nationalists who opposed the
	Roman rule of Israel. The Herodians were named after king
	Herod who was appointed by the Romans. They supported the
	Roman rule of the Herods. So the Pharisees and the Herodians
	were usually enemies. They tried to trap Jesus. If He opposed the
	Roman tax, they would bring this to the attention of the Romans
	and He would be executed for treason. But if He supported the
	tax, He would be denounced as a traitor to the Jews.
