

Bible Study 1 – Renewing my worship – Malachi 1:1-9, 13b-14

A village in Greece learned that the king would pay them a visit. How honored the village officials were! They decided to hold a feast so that every villager could offer the king something. Everyone was asked to bring a pitcher of the finest wine and pour it into a vat from which the king would be served. The king arrived. The moment came for him to taste the rich wine from the vat. However, when one of the officials turned the spigot, out came water. How embarrassing! Each villager assumed that all of the other villagers would pour in their best and one pitcher of water would not make any difference. The result was dishonoring for the king.

The context	Malachi was probably the last prophet of the OT era. He followed the ministries of Haggai and Zechariah. He wrote to Jews living in Judah after the exile in Babylon. Although they had rebuilt the temple, their worship had degenerated into a lifeless formality and they no longer took the law seriously. And there were mixed marriages with pagans, unjust financial practices, withholding of tithes, and spiritual apathy.
