Bible Study 9 – Apostles persecuted – Acts 5:17-42

A train full of toxic chemicals roars down the track with no one aboard. That's the story of the 2010 film "Unstoppable". It's also the true story of CSX 8888, a freight train known as "Crazy Eights". It got loose in Ohio in 2001 and ran without anyone controlling it for two hours before another train was coupled to the rear and applied brakes to slow the runaway to 11 miles per hour. Then an engineer ran alongside, hopped on, and shut down Crazy Eights' engine. Christianity emerged like an unstoppable freight train in the 1st century – the gospel was unstoppable.

The context	Acts describes the spread of Christianity across the Roman
	Empire (1:8). After Christ's ascension to heaven, the Holy Spirit
	arrives to live in believers in Ch. 2. Peter gives the first sermon,
	& the first church begins. Peter heals a lame man and gives the
	second sermon. Then Peter & John are persecuted by the
	religious leaders. The believers shared their possessions with the
	needy, but Ananias and Sapphira died because they lied to God.
