Bible Study 2 - Lydia's conversion - Acts 16:11-15

Do you ever get discouraged in your efforts at reaching out to others with the gospel message? Do you wonder why your ministry plans just don't seem to work out the way that you envisioned? Does it seem like you are witnessing to hearts of stone that have no response to God's gracious offer of new life? It is easy to get discouraged in Christian ministry if we forget our dependence upon the sovereign initiative of God. We are severely limited in what we can accomplish & God has ordained it to be that way. We can try to persuade people of the truth of God's plan of salvation, but God must open hearts before people are able to respond in repentance and faith.

The context	After the Day of Pentecost, the gospel was preached to Jews and
	then to Gentiles. Peter was the main preacher to the Jews & Paul
	was the main preacher to the Gentiles. Paul's first missionary
	journey was to Cyprus and south-eastern Turkey where they
	established churches. Legalistic Jews insisted that male Gentile
	believers be circumcised according to Jewish custom. But a
	meeting of the leaders of the church decided that this was not
	necessary. Then Paul went on his second missionary journey.
