Bible Study 11 - Paul's farewell message - Part 2 - Acts 20:29-38

The historical narrative in the book of Acts is often transitional between the law of Moses and the Christian church. This is the foundational period in the history of the Church of Jesus Christ. Some aspects of the contents of this book must be discerned as not having direct application to the subsequent periods of the church. This episode is not one of them. Like the letters to the seven churches of Asia in Revelation 2-3 which are directly applicable to us today, Paul's final sermon at Miletus to the Ephesian elders in Acts 20 has direct application to us today. Today we are looking at the second half of this farewell message.


The context	After the Day of Pentecost, the gospel was preached to Jews and
	then to Gentiles. Peter was the main preacher to the Jews & Paul
	was the main preacher to the Gentiles. Paul's first missionary
	journey was to Cyprus and south-eastern Turkey where they
	established churches. Then Paul went on his second missionary
	journey preaching and establishing churches. People converted
	to Christianity and some of the Jews persecuted the believers.
	Then Paul went on his third missionary journey.
