Bible Study 12 - Persecution in Jerusalem - Acts 21:27-36

Here we will see how Paul reacts to persecution. Paul had one advantage over us and that was God had explained to him exactly what was to happen. He knew he would be bound and arrested. Despite suffering, he was confident that God was in complete control of every event. He is the Creator and Sustainer of all things. He is ruler and complete sovereign over His creation. God always works and acts on behalf of His children for their good and His glory. Suffering brings us a unique opportunity to grow spiritually and to glorify God. Use it as an opportunity to serve God not as an opportunity to feel sorry for yourself.



	then to Gentiles. Peter was the main preacher to the Jews & Paul
	was the main preacher to the Gentiles. Paul's first missionary
	journey was to Cyprus and south-eastern Turkey where they
	established churches. Then Paul preached and established
	churches on his second missionary journey. Then Paul went on
	his third missionary journey encouraging the churches that he
	had established. Finally, he sailed back to Palestine.
