Bible Study 9 – Jesus' example of forgiveness – Matthew 18:21-35

Imagine you are on a long hike, and each time someone wrongs you, you pick up a heavy rock and put it in your backpack. Over time, your backpack becomes so heavy that you can barely move. Every step is a struggle, and you find it hard to enjoy the journey. One day, you meet a wise guide who tells you to empty your backpack. Reluctantly, you take out the rocks one by one, and as you do, you feel lighter and freer. Forgiveness is like emptying that backpack. Holding onto grudges weighs us down, but when we forgive, we are set free as our burden is lighter and we are closer to God.

The context	Jesus began His ministry in Galilee. He taught about the coming
	kingdom of God and healed many. He called 12 disciples to
	follow Him. When the Jewish leaders began to oppose Him, He
	began to teach in parables. Then He predicted His rejection,
	death and resurrection. And He taught lessons about
	responsibility to others: payment of the temple tax; rivalry over
	greatness in the kingdom; waring against causing others to sin;
	and treatment and forgiving of a sinning brother or sister.
