## Bible Study 18 - Paul's example of generosity - 2 Corinthians 9:6-15

Money is my shepherd; I lack nothing. It allows me to lie down in my luxury bed. It leads me to acquire waterfront property. As long as I manage to hang onto it, it will restore my soul. It leads me in paths of prosperity for my own sake. Even though I walk through the valley of an uncertain economy, I will fear no evil, for my money is with me; its interest and its dividends, they comfort me. My money prepares a table before me in the presence of my envious neighbors; it anoints my life with pleasant luxuries; my retirement savings account overflows. Surely prosperity and security shall follow me all the days of my life, & I shall dwell in a really nice house forever.

9The context	The problems in the church in Corinth (dealt with in the letter of
	1 Corinthians) have for the most part been worked through, and
	Paul writes this letter to encourage them, to explain the love gift
	he is collecting for Judean Christians, and to defend his
	apostleship against critics who are speaking out against him. In
	Chapters 8-9 he urges them to complete their collection for the
	poor Christians in Jerusalem. Chapter 9:6-15 looks at the results
	of generous giving.


