Bible Study 7 – Deliverance via a substitutionary sacrifice – Exodus 12:1-30

Have you ever set a reminder on your phone or tied a string around your finger just so you wouldn't forget something important? We all know how easy it is to forget. That's why we use calendars, alarms, and sticky notes—to help us remember what we dare not forget. In Exodus 12, God gives the Israelites an unforgettable event the first Passover. He wants them to remember it, year after year, generation after generation. So, He gives them special instructions, which would help them remember His power and His faithfulness. The Passover wasn't just about that one night in Egypt; it was about never forgetting what God had done for them.


The context	God sent Moses to Pharaoh to bring the Israelites out of slavery
	in Egypt. Moses was reluctant to obey God. But God promised
	to help him. After Moses asked Pharaoh to let the Israelites go,
	the oppression increased. When Aaron's snake ate the
	magician's snakes, Pharaoh still refused to let them go. Because
	Pharaoh stubbornly refused to let the Israelites go, God sent a
	series of ten miraculous judgments on Egypt. Today we look at
	the 10 th judgment.
