

Bible Study 8 – Salvation through God’s glory – Exodus 14:1-31

Have you ever found yourself in a situation where there seemed to be no way out? Maybe you were stuck in traffic with an urgent appointment or faced a problem that felt impossible to solve. You look ahead, and there’s a wall. You look behind, and trouble is closing in fast. It’s that sinking feeling of being trapped—with nowhere to turn and no good options. The Israelites had just escaped slavery in Egypt, only to find themselves trapped between the Red Sea in front of them and Pharaoh’s army racing up from behind. Panic set in. There was no bridge, no boats, no way forward—and no way back. It seemed hopeless. What would God do?

The context	God sent Moses to Pharaoh to bring the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt. Moses was reluctant to obey God. But God promised to help him. After Moses asked Pharaoh to let the Israelites go, the oppression increased. When Aaron’s snake ate the magician’s snakes, Pharaoh still refused to let them go. Because Pharaoh stubbornly refused to let the Israelites go, God sent a series of ten miraculous judgments on Egypt. After the death of the firstborn in the 10 th judgment, Pharaoh let the Israelites go.
